Objective: To demonstrate control of bleeding in an open soft-tissue wound.

Expose the area to see the wound.	1		
Open, cut, or remove clothing.			
Place a sterile dressing over the wound and apply direct pressure. If you find life-threatening bleeding, control this immediately.			
If the bleeding does not stop, add other sterile dressings over the first dressing and again apply direct pressure. When applying direct pressure to a wound, always observe standard precautions by wearing appropriate PPE.	1

Stabilizing an Impaled Object			
Objective: To demonstrate how to stabilize an impaled object.			
Skill	Max Points	Skill Demo	
Criteria met: Determines the Scene is Safe, Initiates Standard Precautions, Introduces Self & Obtains Permission to treat/help	-	-	
Manually stabilize the object so that it cannot move and damage surrounding and underlying tissues while you perform the next steps in this procedure.	1		
Remove or cut away all clothing surrounding the impaled object. Control bleeding by direct pressure. Apply a donut dressing around the impaled object. Stabilize the impaled object against the body.	1		
Apply a bulky dressing around the object. If the object is long or unwieldy, it may be necessary to shorten it by cutting off some of the exposed portion. Keep the object from being nudged or moved during transport by stabilizing it with tape or bandages. If available, consider securing a plastic cup, a bowl, or half of a plastic water bottle over the object after it has been stabilized.	1
